FDNYSMART TEACHER'S CORNER Introduction

WELCOME TO THE FDNYSMART TEACHER'S CORNER!

This is a resource for you to utilize during Fire Prevention and Life Safety Week and/or any time during the school year. Grade levels are broken down into K-2, 3-5 and 6-8. Each grade level consists of simple objectives based on content from FDNYSmart.org. These developmentally age-appropriate objectives are focused on three main themes: community awareness of trained responders, recognizing hazards in the home, and taking action in a fire emergency.

Each objective is paired with short and long lessons. A short lesson is defined as an approximately 15-minute activity. A long lesson or activity will require approximately 35 minutes of class time. Each activity includes an activity starter called "Act Now" and a closing activity called "Exit Now." Instructions, handout materials, slideshows, videos and podcasts are linked in the "Materials" section of each lesson plan. Activities in each objective can be done as stand-alone lessons, or several lessons can be done in any order. This is your choice!

Each activity is labeled with grade level, objective, lesson number and an indication of whether it is short or long. For example: K-2, Objective 1, Lesson 1 Category Activity (short). The video - FDNY Rescue Ride Along at https://www.fdnysmart.org/fdny-rescue-ride-along/ (13:14) can be used as an introduction to important lessons of fire prevention and life safety. Additionally, NYS Next Generation State Standards are connected to several of these activities to assist in meeting the requirements of your regular lesson plans. An overview of grade level objectives and standards can be found below.
